POSTGRADUATE

After house posts I received a broad base in medicine whilst on the vocational training scheme in Edinburgh. Since then I have had considerable experience in General Medicine at SHO and Registrar level at Ipswich and then at St George's Hospitals.

From August 1989 to September 1991, I was a research registrar in neurology at the Middlesex Hospital under Professor M Harrison - I was involved in the Neurology and Neuropsychology Study on HIV patients, funded by the Medical Research Council. This longitudinal study, which was started in 1987, set out to address the question as to whether HIV infected but asymptomatic individuals show evidence of subclinical neurological damage. At six monthly visits the following were undertaken:- a full history and neurological examination, electrophysiological tests, (peripheral nerve conduction tests, evoked potentials, and

magnetic stimulation), neuropsychological assessments and MRI scans. My role in this study was to undertake the clinical history and examination as well as being involved in the MRI scanning, the immunological aspects and overall coordination of the various specialties involved.

After my research post I spent 2 years first as a registrar at the Middlesex Hospital and then at the National Hospital gaining experience in the neurological subspecialties. As a senior registrar at the Royal Free Hospital I was able to develop my interest in peripheral nerve disorders under Professor P K Thomas and continue my interest in HIV related disorders.

During this period I spent a sabbatical of 4 months with Professor Gerard Said at L'hôpital Kremlin Bicêtre in Paris looking at vasculitic neuropathy in HIV infected patients.

At the National Hospital I run the peripheral nerve service with Dr Mary Reilly with a weekly clinic and inpatients. Two sessions (Camden and Islington NHS Trust) is for the provision of an HIV neurology service. This entails a clinic followed by a ward round on the Patrick Manson Unit on the UCH site. Increasingly I am being referred patients from the Hospital for Tropical Diseases whose patients are on the same ward. At UCLH, I do one general clinic and am part of the attending system for ward referrals with 5 other colleagues.

At Ipswich I do one general neurology clinic with inpatient work and ward referrals.

Apart from my special interests in peripheral nerve and infectious disease neurology, I run a Parkinson's Disease clinic at Ipswich.

In my general neurology clinic I see a lot of patients with headaches, dizziness, epilepsy as well as multiple sclerosis. And have a lot of general neurology experience.

At the present time I am the principle investigator of a clinical trial which is jointly run at UCLH and the Royal London and St Bartholomew's Hospitals – "A randomised placebo controlled double blind trial of Gabapentin for the symptomatic treatment of painful neuropathy in HIV infection".

TEACHING

I have always enjoyed teaching at all levels including nurses and medical students. I continue to be involved in neurology teaching to the undergraduate medical students and the MRCP Part II Course, At the National I teach on the diploma and MSc courses.

At least once a term I chair the prestigious Gower's Clinical meeting at the National hospital – this is a now famous institution at Queen Square with a large audience which includes undergraduates, postgraduates and overseas visitors.

I am now involved with the setting up and teaching undergraduate Neurology at the new Medical school in Beira, Mozambique where I spent 2 weeks in March and will return in 2006.

I wrote the chapter on NeuroAIDS and Neurosyphilis in the Oxford textbook of Medicine (4th Edition).

I have just finished writing and editing the Oxford Handbook of Clinical Neurology (with sections on Neurosurgery, Neurophysiology and Neuroradiology) to be published in 2006.

In 2003 – I was invited to Tan Tock Seng Hospital in Singapore to teach and lecture for two weeks. In 2004, I spent a week doing the same in Chennai and Bangalore (India).

I have just returned for Dubai where I was guest speaker at the Neuro-me 2006 – the 1st International Congress of Emirates Neurology Society (EMINS) and the 5th GCC Neurology Symposium. I gave a talk on Migraine – an update and HIV neurology – an update.
