PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE

DENTAL SURGERY

Having qualified as a dental surgeon in 1979, I worked in maxillofacial surgery at Guy's Hospital, gaining experience in minor oral surgery, major facial trauma and orthognathic surgery. Over the next six years I practiced both hospital and general practice dental surgery whilst simultaneously studying for my medical degree. My dental experience has provided a valuable contribution to my plastic surgery practice.

SYNOPSIS OF HIGHER SURGICAL TRAINING

My higher training in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery took place in district general hospital, regional unit and teaching hospital environments. I received instruction from fifteen consultant surgeons with a wide variety of interests and specialist knowledge. I enjoyed thorough exposure to all aspects of routine and emergency plastic surgery and was encouraged to attend educational conferences and instructional meetings.

As the registrar in Norwich, there was opportunity to gain wide experience in emergency and routine care within a large district hospital. The paediatric unit allowed exposure to children's burn care, congenital hand surgery and a large cleft practice. There was extensive experience in microvascular surgery.

At Mount Vernon Hospital, the large regional plastic surgery and burns unit offered training in every aspect of modern practice, enormous operative experience and a role in administering the department. There was every opportunity to take part in specialist surgery such as ear reconstruction and facial reanimation. Such experience complemented the large emergency and routine workload.

As Senior Registrar at the Charing Cross Hospital, further general experience was combined with craniomaxillofacial surgery, breast reconstruction and hand surgery training. The teaching hospital environment provided contact with many other specialities and the chance to join colleagues in multidisciplinary management of a number of complicated cases. Experience in oncology and complex reconstructive management was extended during an excellent period at the Royal Marsden Hospital, which included chest wall reconstruction at The Royal Brompton Hospital.

ADMINISTRATION AND AUDIT

In my registrar post, I was responsible for the introduction of BAPS coding to the Norwich Computer System, and its subsequent use in audit meetings. I was responsible for rotas and planning of junior staff duties throughout my senior registrar appointments, and have always been involved in all departmental and interdepartmental administrative activities.

In 1993, I ran the Plastic Surgery Senior Travelling Club meeting over three days at Mount Vernon Hospital. Lord Tebbit was our main guest speaker.

TEACHING EXPERIENCE

I have held clinical posts in four teaching hospitals and am delighted that teaching forms a major part of my consultant career. I have always had an active commitment to undergraduate and postgraduate teaching. As an anatomy demonstrator, I taught pre-clinical students in demonstrations and tutorials, and this stimulated my interest in education. As a general surgery SHO, I initiated and ran a clinical revision course for ninety fifth year students prior to their final exams: only one candidate went on to fail surgery finals.

As a plastic surgeon I have been involved in teaching junior colleagues on the ward, in theatres and in the lecture room. I have organised weekly departmental education meetings and have been invited to speak at Royal Society of Medicine training meetings. As a consultant, I have responsibility for medical student education at The Charing Cross and Westminster Medical School.

With the evolution of exciting but shortened postgraduate training courses, I teach basic principles and techniques to junior plastic surgery staff, and help with the planning of rewarding and beneficial research projects.

I have been invited to lecture on a number of national and international conferences.

OVERSEAS EXPERIENCE

In 1979, I won a travelling scholarship to take a student elective in Maxillofacial surgery, for three months at the University of New Orleans.

In November 1993, I joined a team from the Charing Cross Hospital on a two week mission to Northern Bosnia with Mediciens Sans Frontieres to treat victims of the civil war in former Yugoslavia.

I have attended, and lectured on conferences throughout Europe and the United States of America.
